Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted between August 7-August 9, 2021 among a sample of 1996 Registered Voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Registered Voters based on age, gender, race, educational attainment, marital status, home ownership, 2020 presidential vote choice, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.
