Methodology:

This poll was conducted between March 17-March 20, 2023 among a sample of 1002 Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Adults based on region, educational attainment, age, and gender. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
